

Lafayette Circle Undergrounding Project

You might remember the repaving of Mt. Diablo Blvd. and the EBMUD pipeline projects last summer. Well, just when you thought it was safe to come out and shop again in Lafayette, we offer information about another project that will keep it interesting over the next 18 months. Over the last month, PG&E has begun a project that will move all utilities underground along Lafayette Circle (the Shield Block). Currently, crews are digging trenches from private properties out to the street. Sometime in March-April the crews will begin digging up the street. This part of the project will run through December. We are told there will be times when this will get ugly. The following summer of 2010, the entire street will be repaved. The Chamber of Commerce will be sending notices to all the businesses and residents along Lafayette Circle with updated information and we are planning to hold a meeting for merchants to meet and discuss how we can help each other with logistics and parking through the duration of the project. Downtown Strategic Plan Update

Wallace, Roberts & Todd (WRT), the consulting firm hired by the city two years ago to study and develop a Downtown Strategic Plan will be submitting their Draft Plan over the next couple of weeks. After the city receives it, the Chamber will announce a meeting (TBD) to review the plan with our Chamber members and property owners before it is presented at a public workshop. We will announce the date and time of that meeting through our weekly email blasts and our website. Stay tuned.

Lafayette's Budget Review

The Lafayette City Council held a special session on Tuesday, January 13, 2009 to view a presentation by the Budget Review Committee and discuss the recommendations offered. The City Council heard from members of the community. The Committee made six recommendations and the Council acted on them as follows:

1. Convert the old library site to City Offices, funded through certificates of Participation. Transfer balance of current City Offices Building Fund (\$2.0M) to pavement management program.
Council Action: None. Wait until Downtown Strategic Plan is completed.
2. Launch a study to evaluate opportunities for a more cost effective Police Services structure.
Council Action: Agreed. Launch a study to evaluate opportunities for a more cost effective Police Services structure.
3. Reclassify Youth Diversion officer as a non-sworn position. Deferred pending completion of police study.
Council Action: Deferred. Pending completion of police study.
4. Use the current balance in the Parking Fund (\$1.9M) to pave neighborhood roads. Additional parking can be funded either through the RDA or assessment districts, or a combination of both. Additionally, surplus revenue from Parking Enforcement could be used to fund downtown maintenance.
Council Action: Modified. Do not use Parking Fund for roads. Use parking citation revenue to fund downtown vitality programs until an alternate source of funding is identified.
5. Fund future downtown maintenance with new assessments districts (e.g. parking structures, landscaping and lighting, other improvements).
Council Action: Agreed. Fund future downtown maintenance with assessments districts.

6. Increase revenue using one or more of the following options to fund infrastructure repair, additional public safety and downtown vitality:

- Property Transfer Tax
(which would necessitate changing the city from a General Law city to a Charter city.)
- Increase sales tax
- Business License Fee that would fund downtown vitality

Council Action: Deferred. Consider placing some combination of the following new revenue sources before the voters for consideration in the future:

- Property Transfer Tax
- Sales Tax
- Business License Fee
- Parcel Tax

The Lafayette Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors did take a position to not use the parking fund, which has been accumulating since 1992, to fix roads. Instead the money already collected will be saved and used to buy property and create more parking in the downtown.

Spotlight on Lafayette Green Business

Going green is nothing new for Lafayette Tree & Landscape, but now the company has won official recognition from the Bay Area Green Business Program for its long-standing environmental practices.

Raeth, whose design-build landscape contracting company has been greening landscapes for 50 years, says Lafayette Tree & Landscape won recognition for its green practices by doing a combination of the following: (1) recycling office paper, toner cartridges and all other recyclables; (2) installing a solar system to offset office energy consumption; (3) choosing recycled paper and other sustainable products for office use; (4) reducing use of paper by printing double-sided, eliminating unnecessary mailings; (5) installing a water smart controller and irrigation system for plantings; and (6) building the office with highly rated insulation, an on-demand hot water heater, using plywood with reflective foil to cut down on heating/cooling costs, and installing double-paned windows with blinds, among other environmental strategies, like planting trees.

"These are some examples of the steps we are taking in our office," Raeth explains. "But I should also say that our practices carry to our landscape projects, as well. So our customers benefit from our green expertise in every project we take on."

"Sometimes the green choices we make are something simple like recycling green waste, re-using lumber or recycling concrete. But we also have the depth of experience to install some high-tech irrigation systems that can really save water and money over time. The key to going green is looking at projects from top to bottom and making choices that are environmental and cost effective."
