



**Notes from the City:  
Mayor Brandt Andersson**

We have some good news and some bad news on the City's budget.

First, the good news. It is looking like the final numbers for the 2009-10 budget year (we budget from July to the following June) may come in slightly better than anticipated. Our budget always takes a conservative view of the future, and that has proved wise. For the current year, we projected a modest deficit, which could be handled out of our reserves while still more than meeting our reserve target. It now appears that the final budget will be balanced or very close to it. Our healthy reserves should remain intact. The City Council has asked staff to prepare a balanced budget for 2010-11. Pencils have been sharpened and tough decisions made, and despite the expectation of continued low revenues, staff has come through, as they always do. We won't be able to do everything we would like, but we will be able to continue to provide reliable fundamental services to Lafayette's citizens.

The bad news is still pretty bad. A conservative view of the next few years (slow economic recovery, continued low revenues, increas-

**Whole Foods**

The long anticipated opening of Whole Foods in the Shops at Plaza Center became a little more likely when both the Design Review Commission and the Circulation Commission heard testimony at their May meetings to study changes to the façade of the building and most importantly changes to the parking lot and the addition of a satellite parking lot on the corner of Deer Hill Rd. and 1st Street that would be designated for employees of Whole Foods. Without too many more delays, the new store should open around February 2011.

ing contract costs for police services) shows the potential for serious deficits that will cut into our reserves and within a few years reduce those reserves below our long-designated target ~ one half the annual general fund budget. The worse news is that the State's theft of \$2,000,000,000 in funds from redevelopment agencies has now been blessed by a trial court decision. Lafayette's redevelopment agency has had to write a check for over \$1,000,000. Unless the California Redevelopment Association wins its appeal, this opens up the possibility (some would say certainty) of the State continuing to find ways to mitigate its own financial problems by absconding with money intended for cities and counties. As you know, this is an appetite that will not be satisfied in the foreseeable future.

I will end on a glimmer of additional good news. The City has embarked on an education program to inform the public about the implications of the voters adopting a city charter and a property transfer tax. If we put it on the ballot, it will take a majority vote for approval. This would allow a tax only when real estate is sold. It would provide protection from slow economic recovery and looming deficits. Even better, it would not be subject to State raids.

To highlight some of the decisions the Planning Commission is considering, here is a summary of where the PC is likely to come down on key issues:

- Unanimously prefer to leave the building heights along Mt. Diablo Blvd. at 35' by right and not lower the standard to 25'.
- 43' heights would be allowed conditionally.
- Unanimous opposition to the "menu of standards" that would prove tough for developers to achieve and therefore new projects would be difficult at best.

The Chamber of Commerce has argued that lowering of heights and putting developers through such difficult limitations is unfair and would be viewed as a "downzoning" of the property.
